he misty rain may have dampened Wednesday afternoon, but did little to dampen spirits at the opening of Crawford Lake Conservation Area's Gathering Place.

A ceremony was held to officially open the new multi-purpose building in the 219hectare park, which sits adjacent to the reconstructed 15th-century Iroquoian Village.

Each year, Crawford Lake hosts more than 27,000 school children in its educational programs. The Gathering Place will accommodate an extra 4,000 eager learn-

"The new building is already solidly booked by school groups for the entire school year," said Amy Schnurr, manager of Crawford Lake.

The building offers full multi-media presentation capabilities, seating for 120 people, a fully-equipped kitchen and a deck offering a scenic view of the park.

Funds for the Gathering Place were raised by the Conservation Halton Foundation.

"Crawford Lake is a unique park and loved by many, from near and far," said foundation chair Don Ford, adding the park's rare glacial meromictic lake is a geologically significant feature. "The
