

"My clients are urging the rejection of the application," he said.

While the hearing was supposed to have wrapped up Tuesday, it will now carry over to November 10 at 10 a.m. at the Halton Regional Centre.

The board will hear again from Mr.

Kahn, who will present Dufferin's responses to the submissions from Mr. Castrilli and Stan Floras, the solicitor representing the Region and Conservation Halton. These agencies took part in the hearing due to their large involvement in preparing the AMP.

The hearing began in January and has since heard 65 days of evidence. If approved, Dufferin will be granted a licence from the Ministry of Natural Resources to legally extract minerals.

The expansion is supported by the Niagara Escarpment Commission, Halton Region, towns of Milton and Halton Hills and Conservation Halton.

Hwy. 7 pot growhouse case in court

Three men charged in connection with a marijuana-growing operation on the Milton/Acton border will appear at Superior Court of Justice in Milton December 6 to set a trial date.

A judge-only trial at the superior court level was decided on Tuesday at Ontario Court of Justice in Burlington.

Two Milton men — Robert Popp, 36, and Troy Burton, 23 — were charged by Halton Regional Police in June with production of a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking and theft of electricity

under \$5,000.

Rockwood resident Wesley Whitford, 43, faces the same charges.






