




Kids ready to roll for charity

uth-Ann Gray's roller skates are safely stored in her mother's garage, still proudly bearing the red pompoms Ms Gray made for them when she was in grade 7.

They were a Christmas present she remembers to this day.

Of course, they were put away a while ago — the last time she roller-skated was in grade 7 — and a good dusting might be needed to restore the skates to their original luster.

Two weeks from now, those skates will

come out of the garage and see some disco one else to wear. action once again.

November 14 from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Ms Gray — who's artistic director of The Dance Shoppe — and her students, along with Milton Youth Theatre Productions (MYTP), will be taking part in a first-of-its-kind fundraiser.

More than 250 students from the two groups are participating, raising pledges for the Canadian Liver Foundation while also hoping to increase awareness of the risks of liver disease for youth.

It's the first ever youth event being held to raise funds for the foundation.

Although Ms Gray realizes her old skates probably won't fit her anymore, she's planning on bringing them for some-

The students will be decked out in 1970s clothing and skate at least 50 laps each at Scooter's Roller Palace in Mississauga.

"We're getting very excited. They're anticipating me on roller skates," said Ms Gray of her students. "It's nice working with another organization in town and not just being on our own. We're happy to help

The groups are hoping to donate \$5,000 to the Canadian Liver Foundation, and are optimistic the Milton community will be there to cheer them on and maybe even roller skate alongside them for a \$25 dona-


