

Girls fall through attic drywall

A game of hide and seek took a turn for the worst when an 11-yearold girl fell from a garage attic to Sgt. Bob Waller. the concrete floor below, sustaining head injuries.

The incident happened at a Steeles Avenue home Campbellville at about 9 p.m.

'A group of 10 kids were attending a Halloween party and started playing a game of hide and seek," said Halton Regional Police Staff

Staff Sgt. Waller said two 11year-old girls — one a guest, one a resident of the home — climbed up into the garage attic to hide and then crashed through the drywall, falling about 12 feet to the ground.

One of the girls was unconscious

and transported to Milton District Hospital before being airlifted to Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children.

Police said yesterday her condition has improved significantly and it's not anticipated she'll require surgery. The other child was treated and released from Milton District Hospital.
