Art has been a part of his life as long as he can remember, and he studied at the Banff School of Fine Arts in 1972.

"I've had art in me from an early age, but it's only been in the past five years that I've decided to let it out. You reach a point where you say, 'It's time to unearth this thing."

Just last month he was elected FASM president, and he recently took five awards for three of his entries at the Rockton Worlds Fair.

"It was neat being recognized, especially with the number of entries in the field," he said, adding, "It made me quite happy."

His winnings included two first-place finishes in original drawing and acrylic, and a second place in watercolour.

One of the winning entries was a painting of a sunflower, which will be used in a children's book Mr. Repchuk and his wife, Tracy, are working on called Luggage Lizard's World Tour. Each of Mr. Repchuk's illustrations will be paired with a poem by Ms Repchuk, who's an author and a poet. 
As the new FASM president, Mr. Repchuk hopes to bring in new members and ideas to the group — especially with the influx of new residents to Milton.
