Assisting on all three markers was Ricky Bicchierai, while Ian Engstom picked up a single helper on goal number two.

There'd be no turning the tide in round two, however, as the host tykes fell behind early and were whitewashed 2-0 by Stoney Creek. The Winterhawks were penalty-free in both contests.
