





Top team


Delivering a monumental rags to riches story this year, the Marauders took it the whole nine yards — not only winning league gold with a dynasty-ending triumph over the perennial powerhouse Oakville Longhorns, but adding the Canadian Major Football League title six weeks later in Edmonton by knocking off the Calgary Wolfpack 40-27.

Finishing a close second was Bishop Reding's baseball team, which highlighted a stellar season by rallying to eclipse Windsor's Herman Secondary School 6-5 — earning a trip to the all-Ontario Prentice Cup semifinals at SkyDome in the process.

The 28year-old began with her best-ever performance Haydar led all AHL playoff scorers with 26 at the World Cup in Milan, Italy — placing 22nd overall with Catch 22 — and was red hot through the dog days of summer with three championship wins in as many grand prix

appearances. She also won the Jump Canada Series for the third consecutive year with Catch 22, and placed second with Uno.
