Rural residents learn CPR; more sessions could be held in future

A CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) course was held at St. John's Anglican Church January 10 for interested residents.

The course, taught by Blake Hurst of Halton Emergency Medical Services (EMS), was organized by Jean Woods and the St. John's Church Seniors Group to assist residents in recognizing and treating emergency medical situations such as heart attacks, strokes and choking.

"The course was excellent and Blake did a wonderful job," said Ms Woods. "We had 14 people take the course and it worked out well. He (Blake) identified the signs of both heart attacks and strokes and really emphasized being assertive in an emergency situation. He stressed how important it was to call 911 as soon as possible. Timing is everything."

The course, attended by 14 rural residents (a minimum of 12 were needed) lasted three hours and covered a considerable amount of information, including proper procedures for administering CPR, the Heimlich maneuver, and a demonstration on operating a defibrillator.

According to Halton EMS, Halton had a 4 per cent success rate for cardiac arrest victims last year meaning that, of the 362 victims taken to hospital, only 14 left the

hospital and resumed a semi-normal to normal lifestyle. These statistics could be improved if more people are aware of the signs and know how to handle the situation, said Ms Woods.

If there's sufficient interest, another course may be arranged in the future by Ms Woods.

Signs and symptoms of a heart attack

- Chest pain
- Denial
- Difficulty breathing
- Pulse too fast, too slow, or irregular
- · Pale or bluish skin
- Sweating
- Nausea or vorniting

Signs and symptoms of a stroke

- Sudden weakness and/or numbness of the face, arm, or leg, usually on one side of the body
- Difficulty talking or understanding peech
- · Sudden, severe headache
- Dizziness or confusion
- Unconsciousness
