'AA' minor peewees end playoff woes with sweep

There'd be no denying them this time around.

Having failed to win an OMHA playoff series the previous two years, Milton's AA minor peewees were more than a little anxious to end that drought heading into first-round play against Ancaster.

And while a meager three-win regular season suggested hopes for advancement were 'iffy' at best, the Dunsford Landscaping Winterhawks simply refused to buy into that theory — disposing of the Avalanche in three straight games.

Erasing an early deficit, the local lads notched three unanswered goals and later buried an empty netter to eliminate Ancaster 4-2 Friday evening on the road.

"This feels great, it definitely takes the sting out of our regular season," said head coach Dale Waller of the first-round sweep. "We'd been showing improvement over the past few weeks and this was just the pay-off."

Suffocating defence by Bryden Curran and Luke Kimmerer plus fierce forechecking by Marcus Dunsford — who scored the game winner — was just

too much for the Avalanche in the series clincher.

Tyler Jordan was rock-solid between the pipes, while Brandon Nicols, Colin McNabb and Kevin Thomson led offensively with a goal and an assist each. While denied on a penalty shot, Sean McGovern helped set up the winner.

McNabb iced the game with the empty netter, n after taking a picture-perfect feed from

James Hart.

Derek Dercatch and Mark Nordstrom also drew assists Friday.

A two-goal, two-assist performance by McGovern fueled Milton's 6-1 seriesopening triumph January 16 in Ancaster, while last Tuesday's 4-1 win at Milton

Sports Centre put the Avalanche on the

proverbial chopping block.

Thomson came out of the penalty box to score and break a scoreless stalemate midway through game two, while from there Hart and McNabb widened the gap and Nicols potted the first of two empty netters in the series.

Jordan backstopped the Winterhawks to all three wins, and will hope to keep that streak going once second-round play begins against either Guelph or St. Catharines.

Fillies heat up a chilly night

Amid bone-chilling conditions at Woodbine Thursday evening, both My Fine Lady and Serenity Seelster delivered red-hot performances to win their respective \$17,000 second leg dashes of the Miss Vera Bars Pacing Series for three-year-old fillies.

The second leg had been originally slated for January 13, but was pushed back due to an extremely sloppy track that night. The \$43,800 final is now set for Thursday — once again at the Toronto strip.

Sitting third throughout the course of the mile, My Fine Lady and driver Paul MacDonell came on late to take the opening division in 1:59.2.

Armbro Clarica cut the fractions, which were reached in :28, :58.4 and 1:29.4. Pulling the pocket, Selma Hall made a bid in the late stretch, but MacDonell had My

The opening division turned out to be just a five-horse race when 8-5 morning line favourite Lil Miss Hanover was deemed ineligible by the judges. Selma Hall bottomed out the \$61.70 exactor, while Armbro Clarica hung on for third.

Conditioned by Matt Dupuis for Shubenacadie, Nova Scotia's Dr. James Shrive, My Fine Lady lowered her personal best mark with the victory and recorded her first win of the season in her only start thus far. She posted a 5-1-0 record

and collected \$11,608 in earnings last year as a two-year-old.
