Hope tallied twice in game two, with Brown and Mazzacoto chipping in singles.

The AE2 bantams will now face the winner of the Owen Sound and Woolwich series.

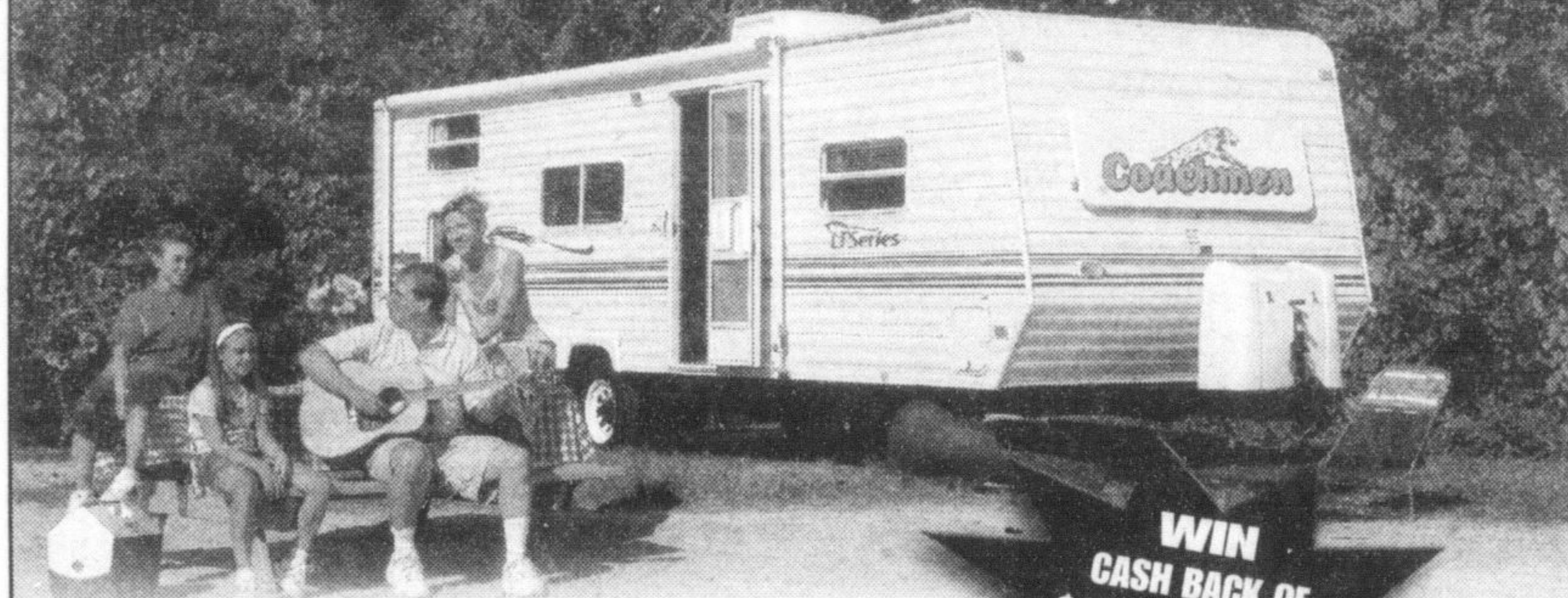
Marshall Vince helped set up goals one and three.

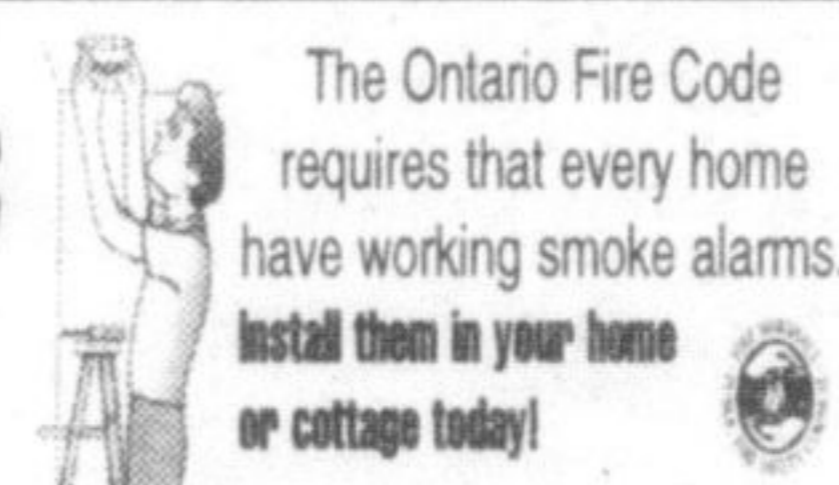

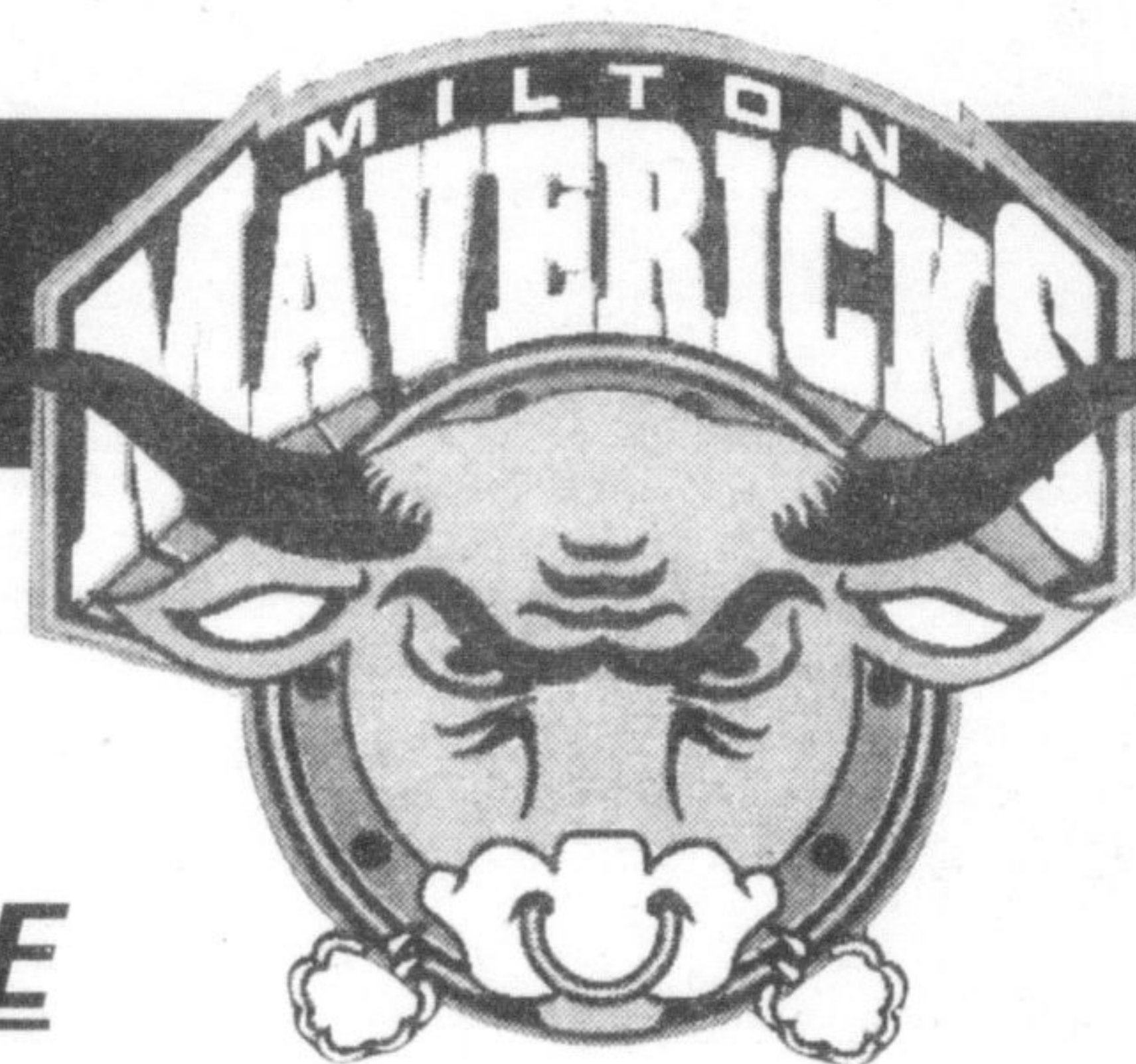
