Teachers seeking change

Ms Weinberger — whose local has been without a contract since Aug. 31, 2004 — said prep time is used for a multitude of reasons, from preparing lessons for class and the assessment/evaluation of students to meeting with administration.

"The teachers of Halton will not settle for less than the 200 minutes of weekly preparation time that Ottawa-Carleton teachers have had for years," said Ms Weinberger. "Either the board starts to take our position seriously or the teachers start to withdraw services. It's up to the board."

Added Ms Noble: "Halton board cannot think of itself as an educational leader while it provides second rate working conditions for my membership."

Ms Weinberger said Thursday's turnout was sub-

stantial because pains were taken to explain issues to the union's membership. During this month, she visited 53 sites to speak to teachers.

"We have a pretty well-informed membership — and obviously it supports the direction we're going," she said.

Ms Weinberger said a meeting with the board and a conciliator is set for February 21.

If there's an impasse, either party can apply for a no board report.

With a strike vote in hand, a strike can legally take place 16 days later. That doesn't mean a strike is inevitable, but Ms Weinberger explained that a variety of tactics, such as a work to rule campaign, are always possible.

"It all depends on the board," she added.

Home Depot employee fined in connection to 2003 accident

An employee of the Home Depot warehouse on Industrial Drive pleaded guilty Wednesday to a health and safety violation after an incident in March, 2003 left a supervisor with critical injuries.

The Whitby resident pleaded guilty at Ontario Court of Justice in Burlington to two charges for failing to work in a safe manner with a machine or equipment,

contrary to the Occupational Health and Safety Act.

A spokesperson with the Ontario Ministry of Labour said the supervisor — a 41-year-old Mississauga man — was struck and pinned by a forklift in the incident.

The employee was fined \$8,000 plus a 25 per cent victim fine surcharge.

HEN conference

The Halton Environmental Network (HEN) will hold its first annual Conference on the Environment February 12.

The theme of the conference is Group Power: Sustaining the Environment through Group Participation, said HEN co-ordinator Stephen Dankowich.
