What comes to mind when you hear the word 'doula'?

Some might think of a midwife, while others simply haven't heard the word before.

That's something Milton doula Jodie Fleming is hoping to clear up at a free information night March 2, when she and two other local doulas — Heather Whitney and Melissa Cassells — are hoping to educate area residents about the services they provide and dispell the myths associated with their profession.

"A doula provides pre-natal, labour, delivery, post-partum and breastfeeding support to women and their partners," Ms Fleming explained.

"I provide them with emotional, physical and informational support. It's not just with the mother, it's the family. We're there to help everybody."

Ms Fleming said in speaking with pregnant women, most aren't aware that doulas exist, or mistake them for midwives, which she noted is far from the truth.

"Doulas do not do anything medical," she said, while midwives conduct medical exams and deliver the baby.

much as they want to be involved. A doula helps the partner feel comfortable with the situation and offers them support and guidance."

Other topics that will be covered at the information night include the benefits of having a doula, like decreasing the risk of having a c-section, and post-partum doulas, who do everything from help with breastfeeding to perform light chores.

The local women also provide pregnancy and newborn photography and bellycasting, which creates a decorative mold of a woman's pregnant stomach.

Ms Fleming noted she's hoping to see pregnant women and their partners, new moms, those thinking of getting pregnant and anyone interested in learning more about doulas at the information session.


"The main thing is letting them know it's out there," she said. "We're hoping to get the community aware of the services available to them."

The event will be held at the Milton Sports Centre in the banquet hall starting at p.m.






