## Local Chinese New Year festival coming

Majestic lion dance will highlight event

hances are you've seen bits and pieces of the traditional Chinese lion dance, with its colourful costumes, dynamic drum beat and artful movements.

But how much do you really know about

February 19 at the Milton Seniors' Activity Centre, 500 Childs Dr., the Canadian Taijiquan Federation is providing a free opportunity for Miltonians to take in the dramatic dance and learn about its purpose and origins at its first ever Chinese New Year's Festival.

With this past Wednesday marking Chinese New Year, Miltonian Vic Benjamin, president of the Canadian Taijiquan Federation, said there's no better time to witness the majestic lion dance and maybe learn a thing or two that could mark the beginning of a whole new jour-

The demonstration will be held from 4 to 5 p.m. by Robin Young and Guelph's Jing Mo Kung Fu Club.

The lion dance, Mr. Benjamin said, is a celebration that combines martial arts, cultural mythology and performing arts. In Chinese mythology, the lion is believed to be brought down from the heavens to bring prosperity and good fortune to the people.

Lion dancers have the task of capturing the mood of the lion, Mr. Benjamin said no easy feat. Drumming creates spirit and strength in the dance, he added.

Those with a deeper interest in Taijiquan - more commonly known as Tai Chi are invited to join the group for the entire day, which will include Tai Chi workshops and demonstrations given by various teachers. The cost is \$50.
