IceHawks, Cougars set to clash

Milton hoping home-ice advantage and edge in momentum proves too much for Burlington

Home-ice advantage won't be the IceHawks' only edge heading into tonight's series opener with Burlington.

Momentum definitely swings in Milton's favour as well, with seven straight wins — highlighted by last Friday's 7-4 decision

Georgetown
punctuating an
adversity-rich year.

By contrast, the Cougars did take three of four points in a home-and-home series with Georgetown late last month, but since then are winless in five games.

And if recent numbers are any indication, the IceHawks look to have more offensive depth than their first-round rivals.

"We've been scoring more since our Christmas slump, and hopefully that carries on into the playoffs," said assistant general manager Kevin Lachance. "I'm very confident we'll beat Burlington. We match up well against them. We've just got to brave those high traffic areas and score from in front."

That'll be easier said than done, given Burlington's size and strength on the blueline.

However, Milton has come through in physically-demanding tests against Hamilton and Georgetown leading up to

the playoffs. A number of players have rediscovered their scoring touch, particularly Brett Robinson, who has 14 goals in his last seven games.

Remarked veteran defenceman Jason Fortino, "We'll beat them in five or six (games). We're a better team than Burlington. We've just got to play like we can."

For head coach George Dupont, that means leaving no room for Cougar comebacks.

While no doubt confident in recently-acquired goalie Tom Fenton, Milton's bench boss knows only too well

that Burlington has a knack for winning low scoring games — including a 2-1 decision over the IceHawks at Central Arena January 16

"A 1-0 game plays right into their hands," he stressed. "Offensively, I don't think they're as good as us, so we've got to find a way to get up on them by more than a goal."

The IceHawks won their season series with Burlington three games to two, including back-to-back overtime triumphs early in the year.

Injuries shouldn't be much of a factor in first-round play, as the Cougars appear to be quite healthy and Milton — hit hard by the injury bug all year — is now at near full strength, with just veteran Adam Pileggi and rookie Matt Davis nursing minor ailments.


