
Heritage work recognized at awards ceremony

the ceremony, which was held at the Milton Seniors' Activity Centre. The Milton Historical Society handed out the Education Award, Visual Arts Award and Writing Award, while Heritage Milton handed out four awards recognizing building renovations or development.

Bruce Carlin of the Milton Historical Society said there are three purposes of the Heritage Awards - awareness of local heritage, recognition of deserving individuals and the celebration of their endeav-

The Educational Award went to John McDonald for his ongoing journey writing a history of the 1918 influenza in Halton and Toronto. It was while conducting interviews for another book that Mr. McDonald said he began hearing first-hand tales of

life during that difficult year. In the back of his mind, he said he knew they'd make an interesting story.

"Once I heard these stories and realized the magnitude (of the influenza), I wanted to delve into it further," he said, adding, "It's wonderful that organizations like Heritage Milton and the Milton Historical Society recognize the people who write our history and restore our buildings."

During his research, Mr. McDonald said his eyes were opened as to how well the doctors and medical authorities handled the outbreak — bravely visiting patients and putting themselves at risk - and accepted the award on their behalf.



The City has initiated a Water Supply Master Plan Project to identify additional sources of water to meet our needs for the next 50 years. Alternatives to be studied include developing additional groundwater supplies as well as developing alternative municipal supplies which could include new surface water sources. This project is being conducted as a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) under Ontario's Environmental Assessment Act

The City is hosting a Public Forum to introduce this important project to Guelph and area residents and to receive your input and comments.


