
That's fairly rare though, and almost all of it within the last five months has had to do with the NHL players union.


somebody is so passionate about an issue we look for reasons to take the opposite view. It's like when somebody's preaching, preaching preaching, we might try to think of something just to shut them up.

That hardly gives us any time. Better care about that one if you know what's good for you.


