




Cheap gas








Celebration of Gary Allan High School's First Anniversary

Gary Allan may have lived only 55 years, but his monumental contribution to Adult and Alternative Education in Halton, will long be remembered. Staff and students at the Gary Allan High School are celebrating the first anniversary of their school name, which was officially changed last year in an effort to recognize posthumously, the significant contributions and leadership he provided. The name change also represented

the uniting of various programs within Halton, which serve the diverse needs of the adolescent and adult communities that are under the current leadership of Karen Gill, Principal.

Gary Allan was a visionary and dedicated teacher. He was sensitive to the needs of his students, particularly those who experienced difficulty in the regular school program. He advocated for an alternative program, which would provide a unique educational opportunity and flexible hours to accommodate personal work schedules. Enrolment in his programs grew and the nature of the program expanded to meet the students diverse needs. Gary was determined to find a way to help these students succeed. More than two decades later, his motto, "Whatever it takes", continues to drive the teachers and programs which have expanded into all areas of Halton, and continues to serve the adolescent and adult communities.

Today, a variety of programs are offered through the Adult, Alternative, and Community Education organization: the Self Reliant Learning Program, STEP (Secondary Teen Education Program), TEAM (Teen Education and Motherhood), Bronte Creek Project and SCORE (Secondary Community Outreach Education).
