... Use Restraint Every Time You Drive!

> Here are just a few lifesaving tips all parents should know about the correct way to use child restaints.

Take A Back Seat

It's the safest place in a crash, and if your car has a passenger air bag, it is essential that children under 12 ride in the back.

Do An About Face

Babies up to one year (up to 20 lbs) should ride in a car seat facing the rear, the back seat.

Keep a Tight Rein

When installing a car seat, make sure your car's o safety belt stays tight around the safety seat. Harness straps go over the child's shoulder and should be adjusted so that you can slip only one finger underneath the straps at your child's

Don't Slouch On Safety

Generally, children up to 40 lbs. should remain in o a car seat. After that, a booster seat may be used along with the car's safety restraint system. The lap belt should fit tight across the upper thighs, the shoulder belt over the shoulder and across the chest.

Local duo sidelined in conference finals

At the risk of stating the obvious, each player's absense creates a substantial void in their team's lineup.



— and has been logging a ton of ice time, both at even strength and on the power-



These work-to-rule sanctions include elementary teachers not attending staff meetings, not attending school committee meetings, and not performing any administrative or custodial functions. Also, at this time teachers will not be organizing any new field trips, however ETFO has agreed existing field trips will go ahead as planned. Further sanctions are anticipated as contract talks continue in Halton and across the province.

Student safety continues to be the priority of the Halton District School Board. A continuous review of school activities that may be impacted by sanctions will be ongoing. This may include the potential to cancel field trips should student safety become an issue.

The Halton District School Board will continue to keep parents and students informed of the work-to-rule implications, or any change to the union's actions.
