

## Book features inspiring story by local woman



t wasn't under ideal circumstances Lori Chapman met the teen. He was someone who'd always been the class clown, and a bit of a troublemaker.

But then, after hooking up with a new girlfriend, he seemed to spiral even further downward and was charged with theft.

It was at the Milton courthouse that Ms Chapman, a social worker, was introduced to the troubled young man, and she had the task of finding him community service hours.

Fortunately, by the end of those hours he was already saying, "Man, I was so stupid." He never saw the girl again.

Fast forward a handful of years. That same young man now owns his own business, a house, and has a new baby.

A passion for helping young people has consumed her for decades, Ms Chapman said. It's this passion that's conveyed in a story she recently had published in a book
