## Big VE-Day event planned

Almost 60 years ago in London, England, throngs of people took to the streets to celebrate a victory over Nazi Germany, signifying an end to the European war.

This May 8, the Royal Canadian Legion in Milton is inviting young and old alike to participate in a parade and afternoon in Victoria Park to mark the 60th anniversary of VE-Day.

"This year has been deemed the Year of the Veteran by the Canadian government," said Laurie MacNab, vice president of branch 136, adding this anniversary has a special importance it'll be the last significant anniversary for many veterans, since most of them are now in their mid-80s.

Starting at 1 p.m. there'll be a short parade for veterans, which will depart from the Legion, 21 Charles St. All veterans — whether they're members of the Legion or not — are invited to walk in the

parade, which will proceed up Main Street to the Victoria Park cenotaph in front of Town Hall on Brown Street.

The walk is being kept fairly short to ensure maximum participation by veterans, Ms MacNab said, adding rides are being arranged for veterans unable to walk.

Police, fire services and cadets will also march in the parade, and Ms MacNab said she hopes there'll be a huge turnout of new and old Miltonians eager to honour the veterans who served their country.

A short ceremony and wreathlaying will take place at the ceno-

This will be followed by an "afternoon in the park the old fashioned way" from 1 to 4 p.m., Ms MacNab said.

Memory Lane Orchestra, a 16piece band, will crank out Glenn Miller tunes from the Victoria Park gazebo, followed by a sing-along of old war tunes with the Kitchen Band from the Milton Seniors'

Activity Centre.

Refreshments will be available, and Ms MacNab is reminding people to bring their chairs or blankets to sit on. Chairs will be provided for the veterans.



Local cyclists can check out the Town's plans for a new BMX freestyle facility at a community open house April 21.


The outdoor facility will be built at Lions Sports Park this summer in response to feedback from BMX riders in the community through previous open houses and surveys.


