

# 20-minute Milton Makeover Apr. 22

You can help make the town shine April 22 during the first 20-Minute Milton Makeover.

The litter clean-up event — organized by the Town of Milton in partnership with the Milton Chamber of Commerce and Milton Downtown Business Improvement Area — will take place town wide at 11 a.m. on Earth Day.

The Town is inviting residents, community groups, students and Milton business employees to gather together to pick up litter on streets, boulevards, surrounding grounds, parking lots, local parks, green spaces and woodlots.

Groups and organizations are encouraged to register for the event by calling (905) 878-7252, ext. 2165, or e-mailing recreation@milton.ca to arrange for special garbage pick-up and to help the Town track participation. Individuals don't need to register.

The Town is asking participants to wear protective clothing such as boots and gloves. Free garbage bags and gloves will be available starting Friday at the Milton Leisure Centre, Town Hall, Milton Sports Centre and the Nipissing Road operations yard.

Other upcoming litter clean-up events include the Nassagaweya Rural Road Clean-Up Day April 30, the Good Neighbours Community Day May 7 and the Brookville Operations Yard Spring Clean-Up Week from May 24 to 28.

The Town of Milton enforces a litter bylaw with set fines for littering. The current litter bylaw is under revision with the set fines expected to be substantially higher, pending council approval in the next several months.

When the 20-Minute Makeover is complete the Town is encouraging residents as well as employees working in Milton to continue their efforts to keep Milton litter-free all year round.

Friendly 'Don't be a Litterbug' signs will be placed on park garbage receptacles and park signs soon to remind residents to dispose of litter.

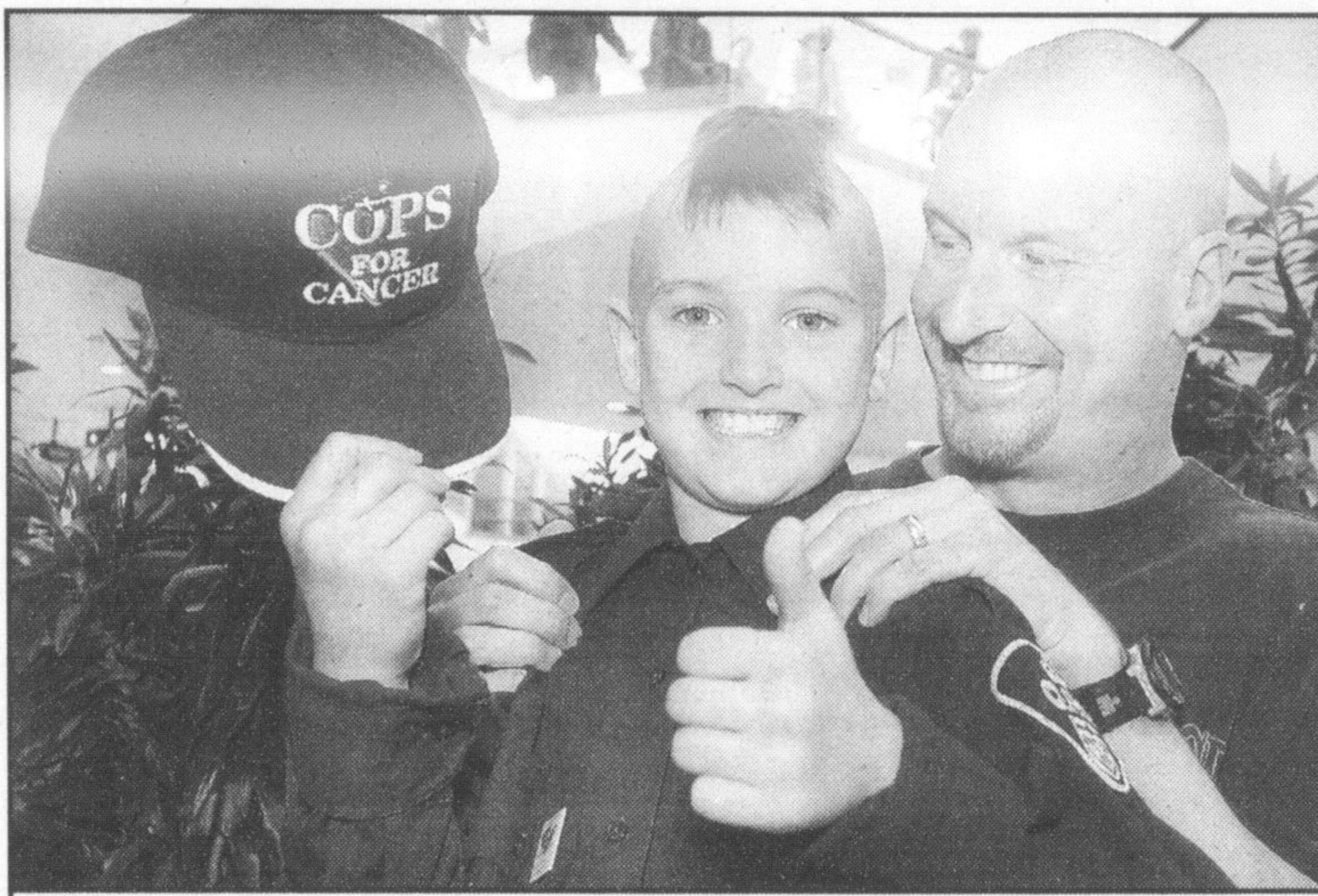
