


Maccauley gets the nod for CIS' East-West Bowl

After back-to-back 0-8 seasons with the Mount Allison Mounties, Zack Maccauley is no doubt itching for a gridiron victory.

That wish could come next month at Waterloo's Wilfrid Laurier University Stadium, where the 20-year-old Miltonian will compete in the 2005 CIS East-West Bowl Game.

Recently named the team's top offensive lineman, Maccauley was one of three Mounties picked to be the East all-stars. He and fellow Mount Allison standouts Michael Bailey and Matt Harding will join forces with those from Ontario and Quebec schools in an attempt to upstage their west-

ern foes May 15.

The selection is the latest in a series of university football accolades for the six-foot-two-inch, 286-pound sophomore lineman, who was named a conference all-star at the end of the regular season, and before that was Mount Allison's top rookie last year.

This marks the second straight year that the Mounties have had three players at the East-West Bowl Game.

Ouellette joins \$100-million club

It was milestone time for Luc Ouellette Tuesday night at Woodbine.

The 39-year-old Campbellville resident - Canada's harness racing driver of the year for 2004 — surpassed the \$100-million in career earnings plateau by piloting Crown Caper to victory in the fourth race, an \$11,000 event for claiming trotters.

A nephew of Hall of Famer Mike Lachance and former standout on the New Jersey Meadowlands circuit,

Ouellette has more than 7,100 driving victories to his credit, which places him 17th overall on the all-time winners list.

Last year, in his first full season on the Woodbine Entertainment circuit, Ouellette dominated the drivers' category, amassing 335 wins and steering winners to more than \$8.2 million in earnings.

The only other drivers to hit the \$100-million mark are Lachance, John Campbell and Catello Manzi.

Dependable playmaker Alex Schroder showed strongly through both contests, but with her top teammate far from 100 per cent, the North Halton champion cagers were essentially grounded. "The teams in south Halton are much more talented, but our girls never gave up, and that second game would have been a lot more competitive if Carly had been injury free," said head coach Cindy Johnston. "But with our whole starting lineup back, who knows about next season?"

Dynamite debut

Debuting at the Durham Classic April 9, E.C. Drury's affiliate club wrestlers delivered some impressive results - including five medals and half-a-dozen top-four finishes.
