

Also part of the festivities will be a free marshmallow roast, nature face painting, storytelling by the lake, craft-making in the Gathering Place and corn, bean and squash planting.


Kids will be able to wrap up their day by participating in the Crawford Lake Quest, a scavenger

Kelso Conservation Area is ready to welcome outdoor enthusiasts who want to explore the hiking and mountain biking trails and discover the solitude of Kelso Lake.

Those who enjoy fishing will be able to cast a line to see if the trout are biting, as Kelso opened for trout season last weekend. The lake was stocked with 8,000 rainbow trout last spring as a follow up of the stocking the year before.

Park visitors can rent a canoe, paddleboat or kayak.

Admission costs \$4.25 per adult, \$3 per child and \$3.50 per senior. Children four and younger are free.


