

Door-to-door art sale might be scam, Halton police warn

Police are warning Miltonians about a possible scam after a Featherstone Road resident bought a piece of art by a woman claiming to be an exchange student from Jerusalem at the Toronto Art School.

The homeowner paid \$140 for the art, but when she called the school to check out the situation, she was told the students didn't go door to door and that there wasn't an exchange program.

The suspect is described as in her mid-twenties with shoulder-length hair, a poor complexion and a strong accent. She was well-dressed, wearing black polyester pants and a red flannel zip-up jacket.
