Local man recognized for saving suicidal youth

A local man who rescued a suicidal ty," he said. youth from the path of an oncoming train has received commendations from the Governor General and Halton Regional Police for his efforts.

Over the past few weeks, Milton's Shane Bascoe has been showered with recognition for his heroic act that he says is "something any Canadian would do."

The incident happened April 29, 2004. Mr. Bascoe was working at the MacMillan Detention Centre, a youth facility on Boston Church Road.

"I was outside with nine other residents playing some basketball," the modest man recalled of the day.

It was then he noticed a 15-year-old male who was a mental health resident at the centre come outside and walk across the road, heading toward a field.

While staff had been instructed to give the youth some time alone to cool down if he walked off the property — an opportunity not every resident had - Mr. Bascoe noticed something was definitely wrong.

"After a couple minutes I realized he was walking farther and farther from the facili-

After giving instructions for the police to be called, Mr. Bascoe took off after the youth, calling his name. They ended up at the railroad tracks, where the youth sat down and planted his feet firmly on the inside of the tracks and his hands on the outside, bracing himself.

"That's when I began speaking with him... we had a good rapport," said Mr. Bascoe, noting they used to play ping-pong together every night.

"I basically said, 'Come on let's go back and play some ping pong.' But he said he didn't care, that he wanted to end his life. Just the look the kid had in his eyes... I'll never forget it."

After about 10 minutes, a train began approaching from the north. "I told him then that I was going to try and pull him off the tracks," said Mr. Bascoe.

But when that method didn't work, he had to result to desperate measures — stepping and punching on the youth's hands.

"I didn't want to do that, but I had no

other choice," he said.

With only about 10 seconds to spare, Mr. Bascoe managed to get the youth off the tracks. He noted that throughout the scary ordeal, he had his own young son in mind.

"I thought, 'This is somebody's child," he said. "Now I've given him a second chance at life."

Despite his actions, the local resident doesn't consider himself a hero and instead praised the Halton Regional Police Service (HRPS) and its response to the situation.

"They just did a perfect job. They made sure he was safe and secure," Mr. Bascoe noted.

He recently received a certificate of commendation from the Governor General and a congratulatory certificate from the Town of Milton, both presented at a Milton council meeting. He also was honoured by the HRPS with a commendation.

Mr. Bascoe summed up his life-saving actions by saying, "It was instinct. It's something I never thought about twice and I'd do it again if I had to."


