# Bertoli's Titans just two wins away from clinching Kelly Cup

America's Memorial Day weekend could be particularly memorable for Miltonian Scott Bertoli.

That's because heading into tonight's action at Sovereign Bank Arena, the 28-year-old ECHL veteran is just a couple of wins away from capturing his first Kelly Cup with the Trenton Titans.

And with home-ice advantage for the next three games and a netminder who's been red hot as of late, the prognosis looks awfully good right now for the New Jersey-based club.

"Our younger guys seem to be out-working them, getting to loose pucks, and our goaltending's been great," noted Bertoli, whose Titans grabbed a 2-0 series lead against the Florida Everblades last week-

end with a 7-0 Saturday drubbing and 2-1 squeaker Sunday.

The local left winger notched the game two winner 8:09 into the final frame, tapping in a cross-ice pass from linemate Nick Deschenes on an oddman rush.

It was his second
goal in as many nights — following a firstperiod tally in the series-opening blowout
— and 18th point in 16 playoff games. He
now sits tied with captain Rick Kowalsky
for the post-season scoring lead after top-

ular season with 27 goals and 41 assists in 70 games.

"Us older guys put pressure on ourselves to come through in the playoffs because we've got the experience," explained Bertoli, whose Titans reached the Kelly Cup finals in 2001 before losing in five games to South Carolina.

Trenton hosts games three and four tonight and tomorrow evening. If necessary, they'll also host game five on the holiday Monday. At games will be broadcast live on the NHL network on both Cogeco and Bell ExpressVu.

Native Miltonian Craig Brush is the general manager and part owner of the Everblades, who lost last year's Kelly Cup championship to Idaho.

The Royals had a couple of golden opportunities early on, but just couldn't dent the twine.

The championship defeat followed a near-perfect 4-0-1 regular season campaign and 1-0 shutout of Milton District in the semis. Delivering impressive efforts in Burlington Tuesday were defender Ryan Fernandez and mid-fielder Joey Melo.

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT CHARGES BY-LAW BY THE HALTON DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD

#### PUBLIC MEETING ON JUNE 22, 2005

The Halton District School Board proposes to amend the 2004 Education Development Charges By-law (the "2004 By-Law") the Board passed on June 9, 2004.

The 2004 By-law came into effect on June 14, 2004. The schedule of Education Development Charges imposed by the By-Law is as follows:

- \$791.00 per dwelling unit in regard to residential development
- \$0.22 per square foot (\$2.37 per square metre) of gross floor area in regard to non-residential development

The proposed amending By-law will increase the charge on residential development to \$941.00 per dwelling unit and the charge on non-residential development to \$0.26 per square foot (\$2.80 per square metre) of gross floor area. The increase in the charge is due to an increase in the education land costs to be incurred by the Board over those estimated when the 2004 By-law was passed.

The 2004 By-law referred to above applies to all lands in the Region of Halton. Accordingly, a key map showing the location of the land subject to the said By-law is not provided as part of this notice.

The Board will consider the proposed amending By-law at a public meeting to be held on June 22, 2005 at 6:00 pm in the Board Room, Halton District School Board, 2050 Guelph Line, Burlington. All interested persons are invited to attend the public meeting.

The Board would appreciate receiving written submissions one week prior to the public meeting, so they may be distributed to the trustees for their review prior to the meeting.
