The purpose of the PIC is to review and obtain public input on the corridor alternatives for Tremaine Road and James Snow Parkway extension, factors for analysis and the selection of the preferred corridor. The preferred corridor is being selected by considering the Natural Environment, Social, Economic and Transportation Operation effects and impacts. Anyone with an interest in the study is invited to

attend and participate. If you cannot attend and would like to provide comments, please forward them by Wednesday, June 22, 2005 to the Regional Municipality of Halton at the address below. Following the PIC, study findings will be reviewed in light of comments received and preferred routes for each corridor will be determined. A second PIC will be scheduled for January 2006.



The map below shows the approximate limits of the study area.




# Wilton Urban Bulk Collection


