## Naqvi to carry NDP banner once again

Gets nod as party's Halton candidate for next federal election

Anwar Naqvi has once again been chosen as Halton's NDP candidate for the next federal election.


The local riding association held its nomination meeting Thursday where Mr. Naqvi emerged victorious after being contested by Kilbride resident and political science university student Chris Marquis and longtime local farmer Phillip Buck.

While Mr. Naqvi said he doesn't think an election will be called any time soon, he noted that he's "ready to go."

The north Oakville resident's face will be familiar to many as he ran just last June against current Halton MP Gary Carr for a seat in Ottawa. Prior to that he was the NDP candidate for the provincial election in Oakville.

"My previous experience will help me. Experience always gives you expertise," he said. "Now, I also know my riding well."

He said when an election does happen, there are several issues he'd like to address in his campaign, such as working to get an inter-regional transit service going and more help for immigrants in their search for jobs.

## Subdivisions' re-zoning okayed

Two residential subdivisions planned for Derry Road received necessary re-zoning approvals from Milton council last week.

Council also supported granting draft plan approvals for the proposed subdivision plans, both subject to some conditions.

One plan was put forward by Mattamy Homes for 75 acres at the southwest corner of Thompson and Derry roads.

It includes a mix of 309 single and semi-detached homes, 135 townhomes, a commercial block that will permit car service station use, a village square and park.

The other came from Transcon Properties Ltd. of Hornby for an approximate 25-acre property on Derry Road, west of Fourth Line.

Those plans consist of 97 single-detached homes, a neighbourhood centre with 135 dwelling units, a park and woodlot.

Town Senior Planner Barbara Koopmans explained that the neighbourhood centre will most likely consist of townhouses designed for condominium ownership.

The initial proposal had 59 single-detached homes and 48 semi-detached houses, but due to market demands, plans were revised and the semis were replaced with singles, a report from Town Director of Planning and Development Mel Iovio stated.

The report also said, "In response to concerns raised at the public meeting relating to potential conflicts with the elementary school (nearby), the developer has eliminated the commercial component from the neighbourhood centre area block."

#### New school needed in area

Both the Town's Official Plan and the Halton District School Board's Capital Strategic Plan identify the need for a new elementary school in the vicinity of the Mattamy subdivision. The board's plan says the proposed school would be a 620-student building.

The zoning bylaw amendments changed both lands from future development zones to residential medium density and open space. Part of the Mattamy development was also re-zoned commer-




