

Bishop Reding track duo show strongly at OFSAA


Midgets Bugaj and Bennett both crack top eight

Patryk Bugaj and Wayndale Bennett have certainly set the bar high for the remainder of their high school track and field careers.


The 15-year-olds not only reached OFSAA in their first year at Bishop Reding, but both reached their event finals as well at the 57th All-Ontario showcase late last week in Lasalle.

Shedding more than a second off his South Regional silver-medal finish one week earlier in St. Catharines, Bugaj delivered a personal best 53.50-second performance in the midget boys 400-metre race — which was good enough for sixth-place honours.

Making his strong showing even sweeter was the fact that he eclipsed Denis Morris High

School's Lee Mori, who beat him for South Regional gold.

Bugaj had the exact same times in both the preliminary race and the finals.

Bennett's top-eight placing came in the field, where he fell just short of the personal best 5.77m long jump that had given him gold in St. Catharines.

His 5.59m showing put him seventh among the midget boys.

Bennett's first leap turned out to be his best, while he fouled on the last three attempts — during which the top-five finishers were all at their best.

Bugaj and Bennett are the first top-eight OFSAA placers from Milton since BR star racer Ian Butcher struck gold and set a new provincial record in the midget boys 400m in 2002.
