#### Men's teams dominate at Ontarios

The Milton Lawn Bowling Club will be well represented at this summer's Canadian 4's championships.

Two local men's teams delivered a one-two punch at last weekend's provincials in Niagara Falls — grabbing both berths to the national showcase August 15 to 20 in Kitchener.

Meanwhile, a local women's team — including Milton's Laura Seed (skip) and Heather Comba (lead) - fell just short of qualifying for nationals with a third-place showing. The foursome was rounded out by vice Sheila Lumley and second Christine Wild.

### Triathlete golden

Scott Davis' medal-winning efforts continue.

The nine-year-old Milton Marlin turned back all challengers in the 10 and 11-year-old boys class at the London-Lakeshore Triathlon Saturday - thriving amidst unfavourably-hot conditions to tame the 100-metre swim, 7.5-kilometre bike, 2-kilometre run in 29 minutes and 11 seconds.

He finished roughly half-a-minute ahead of the second-place finisher to upgrade the silver he earned late last month in Caledon. Meanwhile, fellow Marlins and siblings Tam and Bronwyn

Kilbourn showed strongly as well.

Thirteen-year-old Tam placed third spot among the 12 and 13 boys ranks - clocking in at 41.51 over the 200m swim, 12.5km bike, 2.5km run course. Ten-year-old Browyn's 40:50 finish in the 100m swim, 7.5km bike, 2km run was good enough for 13th in the 10 and 11-year-old girls division.
