Truck repair business may open at former proposed site of strip club

The Town is one step closer to ensuring a proposed strip club council tried to stop several years ago never sets up in Milton's west end.

The owner of the Steeles Avenue property is now proposing a truck repair facility instead, which with zoning changes would effectively remove an adult entertainment parlour as a permitted use for the land. That was the topic of a public meeting held Monday night during town council.

The Town's Manager of Development Review Anne Dawkins outlined the repair facility plans, noting it's being proposed as a temporary use for the land.

If council approved it as temporary, it would be permitted for three years. After that, council could review the matter and would have the option to renew it.

A zoning bylaw amendment would also be required for the land to change it from its current business park site-specific zone to the standard business park zone.

While the temporary nature of the pro-

posal raised some concerns at the meeting that a strip club could set up there after three years, Ms Dawkins assured council that "this application will result in that use no longer being permitted."

Milton resident Mike Grimwood was the only person to speak at the meeting. He asked Town staff about the types of trucks that could be on the property and whether there would be controls on the number of vehicles permitted.

Ms Dawkins said there could be "anything from construction-sized equipment to delivery-sized equipment" at the proposed repair facility.

She noted there've been no discussions on controlling the number of trucks, but said obviously the size of the site would limit the volume of vehicles at any given time. She added this is something staff can look into further.

Mr. Grimwood said he also has concerns regarding the ability of Steeles Avenue to carry the extra truck traffic.

At the end of the public meeting, Mayor Gord Krantz expressed his enthusiasm

with the proposal and his hopes for not having a strip club on the land.

"In my opinion, this is a good news story," he said.

He told The Champion that a truck repair facility "is certainly better than a strip joint," adding it's important to him that this current permitted use disappear.

Council previously denied the application that would've allowed for a strip club, but it was then approved by the Ontario Municipal Board. Ms Dawkins said the development never proceeded.

She added while the Province has said municipalities have to make room for strip clubs somewhere, council directed that they should be north of Hwy. 401.

Council received a staff report on the proposal for information purposes. A technical report with recommendations on the application will be brought forward at a future meeting once it's been evaluated and all comments have been received and reviewed.


