# More national gold for local lawn bowler

Anderson's 4s team shakes off lacklustre start to top field

When it comes to high-stakes competition, there's just no substitute for experience.

Local lawn bowling ace David Anderson can certainly attest to that, with his seasoned Etobicoke-based fours squad recently striking gold at the Canadian Bowls Championships in Kitchener.

It was the second title in three
years for the 41year-old Milton
vice and his teammates, who this
time around had
to call on their
composure as
much as anything
else in order to
come out on top
in an especially
competitive field.

Two losses in their first three matches left Anderson and company needing to fend off defeat throughout the remainder of round-robin play to have a shot at the finals.

"We looked at it like 'We're playing terrible yet we're still in it. If



we can play like we're capable of we've still got a chance," recalled Anderson, who won the national singles championship in 2002.

Refusing to be upstaged the rest of the way, Etobicoke delivered decisive wins over B.C. (22-15), Quebec (18-9) and Alberta (19-10) and battled to an 11-11 stalemate with Manitoba — whose skip Steven Shinnie came through with an unbelievable performance in an epic battle that saw Anderson tie things up in the final end.

There'd be no such drama when the two teams met again for gold, as Etobicoke overcame a slow start and Shinnie faltered on a high-risk shot in the 12th end that clearly shifted the momentum away from Manitoba. Anderson's foursome would cushion its lead over the balance of the championship clash to prevail 19-13.
