

# Police set to host traffic safety event

Learn more about the rules of the road tomorrow at the Halton Regional Police Service's Family Traffic Safety event.

A variety of demonstrations and hands-on activities will be held from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Oakville Town Hall on Trafalgar Road, across from Oakville Place Mall.

"Halton Regional Police Service and the Town of Oakville have an ongoing commitment to traffic safety and making our roads safe for everyone," said Insp. Jackie Gordon.

"Enforcement is an ongoing priority, but just as important is educating our community about traffic safety."

Traffic safety education will be provided through:

- A booster seat display and child safety seat clinic. Limited space is available and appointments can't be made.
- A police motorcycle and police cruiser on-site for visitors to check out.
- A bicycle safety rodeo. Children should bring their bikes and helmets to participate.
- Information and demonstrations on the legal use of electric/motorized scooters, pocket bikes, mopeds, electric bicycles, Segways and other personal mobility devices.
- Demonstrations on school bus safety and school crossing guard safety.
- Demonstrations on traffic signal operations.
- Intoxilyzer (Breathalyzer) testing.
- A radar demonstration and an opportunity to try out the radar machine.
- Mothers Against Drunk Driving's 'fatal vision' goggles. Visitors can put them on and try to walk the line.
- A demonstration from Motocross racer Jeff Lowe.

McDonald's Restaurants will be on hand to provide free barbecue fare.
