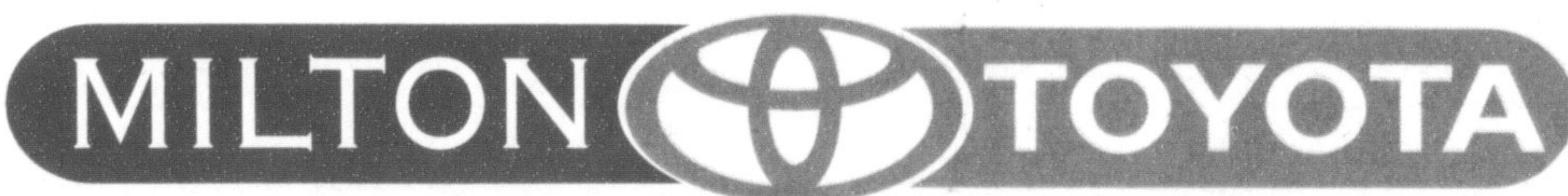

Farmer gets trapped in machinery

A farmer was pinned between heavy machinery Friday afternoon, resulting in a response by the Milton and Mississauga fire departments, plus Halton EMS.

The incident happened on the man's Eighth Line property, north of Derry Road, just before 3:30 p.m.

Milton Fire Department training technician Barry Kory said it seemed the man was attempting to lift a heavy snowplow blade for transport with a front-end loader.

For reasons still unknown, he said, the victim got out of the loader and was trapped between the blade and the bucket of the loader.

"Both legs were trapped by a very, very heavy load," Mr. Kory said.

The Mississauga Fire Department was first on the scene, and personnel got to work stabilizing the snowplow blade with wooden blocks to prevent it from slipping and crushing the victim further, Mr. Kory said.

When the Milton crew arrived, it assisted the Mississauga department, Mr. Kory said.

The victim was taken to hospital and treated for serious, but non-life threatening injuries.

Forklift runs over man's ankle

An employee of a warehousing company on Esquesing Line was injured when a forklift backed over him Friday afternoon.

Halton Regional Police responded to the factory at the corner of Esquesing Line and Steeles Avenue at about 3:30 p.m.

Sgt. Glen Randall said a forklift ran over the victim's ankle, most likely breaking it.

Halton EMS couldn't confirm the extent of his injuries due to patient confidentiality, but said the injuries were non-life threatening.

The incident is under investigation by the Ontario Ministry of Labour.
