## Third rural forum to be held Oct. 18 at Kelso museum

Enhancing communication for rural residents has been a goal for Regional Chairman Joyce Savoline since the last election when a concern was raised that there was a lack of consistent media reporting and communication in Halton's rural areas.

She's working to achieve that goal by holding the third Rural Community Forum October 18 with Halton Regional Police Chief Ian Algar to discuss issues pertaining to rural residents.

"I undertook to hold meetings in the rural area for rural residents to discuss issues that are important to them," said Ms Savoline.

"This is the third meeting since the last election and I feel that they are successful for opening the lines of communication."

Held in the Hearth Room of the Halton Region Museum (Kelso Conservation Area) at 6 p.m., the meeting will provide a chance for residents and the Region to openly discuss issues such as safety and security, speeding and illegal parking, the new Halton tree by-law, organics collection, traffic and road maintenance, as well as ways to further enhance communication with rural residents.

Region staff will be on hand to answer any questions that may be raised by residents during a question-and-answer period.

Ms Savoline and Chief Algar will also bring back questions from the previous meeting that they didn't have answers to at the time and incorporate them into the discussions.

Both previous meetings, held in the fall of 2004 and this past spring, were well attended, and Ms Savoline said she's expecting the same turnout this time around. She added that even if the attendance is less, the meeting will still be worthwhile.

"It wouldn't matter if only 10 residents turned out, the meeting would still be successful in the fact that the Region and the rural residents are communicating," she said. "Those 10 people can pass the information on to their neighbours and so on and so on. The more aware the public is, the more support the Region and the residents can give each other."

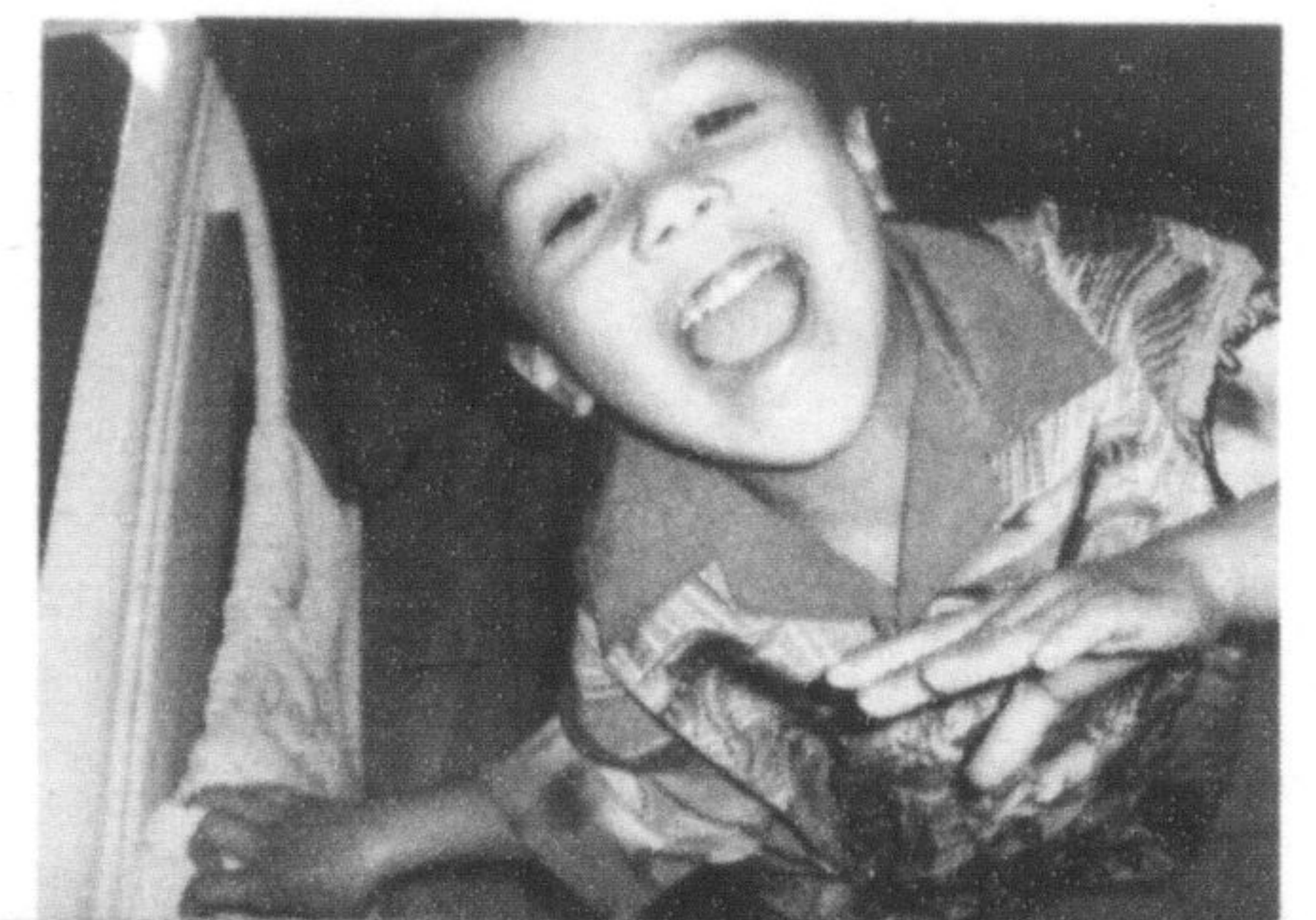
