



### PROPOSED SALE OF THE COUNTRY HERITAGE PARK PROPERTY CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT NOTICE OF PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE

Earth Tech Canada Inc., on behalf of the Ontario Realty Corporation (ORC), is conducting an Environmental Assessment (EA) for the proposed sale of the Country Heritage Park (CHP) property (formerly the Ontario Agricultural Museum) to the current operators of the site for its continued use.



The Province of Ontario is considering selling this property to Country Heritage Experience Inc. (CHE), a not-for-profit organization for its continued use as a heritage park and agricultural museum. The property consists of 69 buildings of varying age and heritage value located on approximately 80 acres immediately south of Highway 401, adjacent to the Kelso Conservation Area, in Milton, Ontario.

# Streaking 'Hawks lay waste to basement-dwelling Buffalo

It promised to be a night of stats padding for the hosts, and proved to be nothing more.

While top gunners Luke Dubbin and Chase Langeraap were kept off the scoresheet, the IceHawks still enjoyed an embarrassment of riches at Memorial Arena Friday evening — burying the lowly Buffalo Jr. Sabres 11-1.

It was the Western Conference frontrunners' third blowout win of the season and closed out their September run at 7-0-1-1, with a measly 16 goals scored against them over that stretch.

Milton unloaded with eight second-period goals, including the first shorthanded tally of the year by veteran defenceman Jeff Caister — one of 10 players who recorded multi-point games.

Paolo Bottiglia tallied twice, while the IceHawks'

Second 10-goal victory of nine other goals were each deposited by a different stick - strengthening the belief that the IceHawks are the deepest offensive force in the league these days.

Matt Read had a goal and three assists, while also standing out with three points apiece were Caister,

> Brandon DeFazio, Jordan Skinner and rookie blueliner Cody Goloubef.

Shots on goal favoured Milton 52-19, with back-up cager Andrew Loverock facing only half-a-dozen quality scoring chances - including the upstairs wrister put in by Jeremiah Crowe 15:39 into the middle stanza.

The game was rather quiet from an extra-curricular standpoint, with each team taking just two minor penalties.

The IceHawks will look to keep their early-season assault going tonight, when they visit the Bramalea Blues. Game time is 7:45 p.m. From there they begin a two-game home stand Friday evening against the defending Dudley-Hewitt Cup champion Georgetown Raiders, who've quickly picked things up after a poor opening weekend and now sit second in the division.


