## Hawks still tops

Remain first in CJAHL rankings

The IceHawks remain Canada's top Tier 2 Jr. A club.

With Saturday's 5-1 win over the defending Dudley-Hewitt Cup champion Georgetown Raiders, Milton kept its penthouse view of the CJAHL rankings — improving to 11-0-1-1 and staying ahead of Alberta's Fort McMurray Oil Barons of the AJHL.

The Nanaimo Clippers (BCHL), Spruce Grove Saints (AJHL) and LaRonge Ice Wolves (SJHL) round out the top five clubs for week three's rankings, released Tuesday. Also from the Provincial Jr. A League, the Markham Waxers sit 10th nationally.

The IceHawks remain the only team in the country without a regulation time loss and sport both the best goals-for and goalsagainst averages in their league.

Having been scored on just 23 times with just over a quarter of the schedule now complete, they're also likely to break the club record for fewest goals against in a season — set at 127 by the 1997/98 All-Ontario championship squad. Last year's team fell four goals shy of equaling that mark.

Matching or even breaking the franchise record for fewest losses in a season — established by the 1998/99 squad, which was beaten only five times — also seems within reach right now.

Milton has a relatively light schedule ahead, with just three games in the next two weeks — including tonight's home-ice tilt with the struggling Mississauga Chargers. Monday night the IceHawks head to Hamilton to take on the Red Wings.
