

## Library renovations slated to start soon

Renovations at Milton Public Library should soon be getting underway.

A funding approval given by Milton council at its meeting last week allows a tender for the work to be awarded and construction to start.

Renovations will include modifying the lower level of the library to accommodate the public and transforming the former Safe and Sound daycare property at 407 Pine St. into office space for library staff, a Town staff report to council explained.

Council supported transferring \$100,000 from the library reserve fund to the central library renovations capital project, which was necessary since the lowest bid for the work was \$100,000 over budget.

The total budget for the project is now \$500,000.

# CH to host meeting on development regulations

Watershed residents can learn more about a new provincial regulation that prevents or restricts development in certain areas at public information meetings Conservation Halton (CH) is hosting next week.

The events will look at Ontario regulation 97/04 — 'Development, Interference Wetlands and Alterations to Shorelines and Watercourses', which results from revisions the Province made to the Conservation Authorities Act.

CH staff will present the new regulation and available mapping to date and explain how landowners may be affected by changes to the directive.

One meeting will be held Wednesday at Hugh Foster Hall, located beside Town Hall at Brown and Mary streets, and another will take place Thursday at CH's administrative office at 2596 Britannia Rd. in Burlington.


Both meetings will run from 4 to 9 p.m., with presentations at 7 p.m.

The sessions are being held to inform residents who live in the Bronte Creek, 16-Mile Creek and urban watercourses of the required changes to CH's existing regulation and to solicit feedback on CH's draft regulatory and land use planning document.

The new regulation is a key tool in helping conservation authorities fulfill their mandates to prevent the loss of life and property due to flooding and erosion, and to conserve and enhance natural resources.

The directive prevents or restricts development in areas where the control of flooding, erosion, dynamic beaches, pollution or the conservation of land may be affected. Development within areas that are adjacent or close to watercourses, flood plains, valleys, wetlands or shorelines may be affected by the regulation.
