A session on identity theft, which will also include introductions to Seniors and Law Enforcement Together (SALT) and community policing committees, will be held Monday at the Milton station, 490


Childs Dr., starting at 7 p.m.




TREE TRIMMING IN THE SOUTH AREA

Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. has awarded the Tree Trimming contract for the south Area of Milton to Quality Tree Service.


The trimming of trees will commence NOVEMBER 7, 2005 and will be completed by FEBRUARY 28, 2006.
