

Arrests made in connection with rural B&E spree

Halton Regional Police officers spent part of Wednesday night and early yesterday morning tracking down a couple of thieves who made several hits in the Campbellville area.

The incident started just before midnight Wednesday, when an alarm alerted police to a pair of suspects who had attempted to gain access to a Crawford Crescent business.

The suspects fled on foot. Police noticed an Avis rental truck that had been reported stolen from Kitchener earlier that night.

The suspects then entered the KOA campgrounds and broke into a shed before being scared away. Police said they then fled to the area of Mohawk Racetrack, where they stole a Ford pick-up truck.

An arrest was made in the area of Second Line West and No. 10 Sideroad.

Two Toronto men, aged 38 and 39, were charged with counts of break and enter with intent, mischief, possession of stolen property over the amount of \$5,000, break and enter committing theft, theft over the amount of \$5,000 and possession of break and enter tools.

Drugs found in raid

Almost a dozen drug charges were laid after Halton Regional Police raided a Parkway Drive home Saturday night.

The seizure and an arrest were the result of an investigation and surveillance by the Milton and Georgetown division task forces and the Regional drug unit. Discovered in the house were drugs including marijuana and magic mushrooms, as well as cash scales.

An 18-year-old Parkway Drive man has been charged with three counts of trafficking, eight counts of possession for the purpose of trafficking and four counts of breach of recognizance.

Weapon charges laid

Weapon charges were laid Saturday after a vehicle was searched in the area of Martin Street and Market Drive.

Impaired driving charges laid

Police said the vehicle was pulled over just after 12:30 p.m. Two three-inch flip blades were discovered and seized. A 25-year-old Brampton man has been charged with possession of a prohibited weapon and failing to comply with a probation order.

Impaired driving charges were laid Monday evening after police found someone who appeared to be intoxicated sitting inside a running vehicle on Victoria Street. The incident happened at about 9:30 p.m. A 41-year-old Martin Street man has been charged with care and control of a vehicle while impaired and having over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.

Impaired driving charges were laid Sunday night in the area of Thompson Road and Sprucedale Lane. Police received a call just after 8 p.m. reporting a driver who appeared to be intoxicated. An arrest was made. At the station, a breathalyser test was refused. A 49-year-old Ontario Street man has been charged with impaired driving and refusing a breathalyser test.
