Why Remember?

Today is Remembrance Day. How did you spend it? Did you remember, or reflect upon, the uncommon valour of our veterans? Could I ask you to think of them right now?

Some veterans bear visible signs of their service: a missing limb, a jagged scar, a certain look in the eye. Others may carry the evidence inside them: a pin holding a bone together, a piece of shrapnel in a leg - or perhaps another sort of inner steel that holds them together: the soul's ally forged in the refinery of adversity. Except in parades, however, the men and women who have kept Canada safe wear no badge or emblem.

Who are our veterans?

Many were anonymous heroes whose strength and courage died unrecognized with them on the battlefield or in the ocean's sunless deep. Many

charged the beaches of Northern Europe only to be mowed down in the storm of bullets that rained down mercilessly upon them. Many, the survivors, marched on to liberate a continent and brought life to those held in Nazi death camps. Many were eyewitnesses to the most heinous crimes against humanity. Many showed exquisite bravery in Korea, battling near the 38th parallel, and wonder when if their heroic exploits will ever be valued. Far too many have now lost their brides and long for the days that their wives were still alive to hold them when they fought through the nightmares of yesterday's memories.

Our veterans were ordinary, and yet extraordinary human beings, persons who offered of the most vital years of their lives in the service of God and of country, and who sacrificed their ambitions so others, at home, would not have to sacrifice theirs.

They were soldiers and saviors who battled against the darkness and their lives supply the strongest argument and the most credible testimony to the

world of the cherished qualities of true Canadian character. They embody our best!

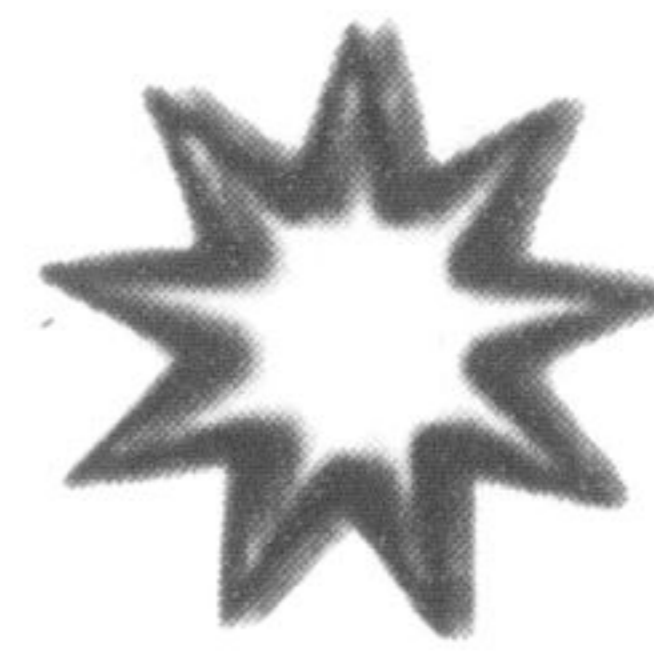
