



Yard Waste Collection Tips



Acceptable Items include:

Yard and garden trimmings, leaves, pumpkins, fallen fruit and tree and brush trimmings

Unacceptable Items include:


Grass clippings, tree stumps, sod, soil and rocks, garbage and recyclable material

Tips for setting out your yard waste:

- · Use open, reusable, rigid containers such as bushel basket or plastic tub
- · Place a yard waste sticker on your container (available from Halton Region)
- Use a paper yard waste bag

Brush:

Bags, containers must be less than 23 kg (50 lbs)



Note: Yard waste placed out in plastic bags (including decorative plastic Halloween bags) and cardboard boxes will not be collected.
