## Late surge powers 'Hawks to victory

But Milton sub-par overall versus Blues

he IceHawks' 6-4 victory in Bramalea Tuesday night sparked a mixed reaction from head coach/general manager George Dupont.

And for good reason.

His Western Conference front-runners certainly proved they can produce under pressure, tallying four goals in the final 7:13 of play — including a last-minute empty-netter by Matt Read, However, Milton's fierce finish didn't quite overshadow what was by and large a second-rate performance against the significantly improved yet still vastly inferior Blues.

"Championship teams find ways to win when they don't deserve to, which is encouraging. But on the down side we've got to learn that we can't show up for 10 minutes and expect to win," Dupont remarked, following what was arguably the ugliest victory this season.

Fresh after taking a 10-minute misconduct late in the middle stanza, emotional sparkplug Aaron Lewicki potted the game winner on a scramble with 1:21 remaining. He and linemate Read each scored twice and combined for seven points, with Read netting the most stylish goal of the night just before second intermission — using his speed to split the defence and bury one in low past Blues cager Michael Nigalis.

Adam DeJong and Kole Bryce wiped out Bramalea's 4-2 lead with an upstairs wire and deflection respectively.

Otherwise there wasn't much good to say about the IceHawks' latest road trip, which was marred by ill-timed line changes and downright pitiful execution on the powerplay.

Some late penalty trouble allowed the


Blues to pull ahead by a pair with a twoman advantage goal seven minutes into the final frame, bolstering their hopes for an upset victory.

Milton's defencemen factored heavily into the evening's production with six assists, including three by Jason Fortino. Bryce's equalizer — the first goal for the recently-acquired Jr. B winger — was set up with a blueline blast by rookie blueliner Cody Goloubef.

Shots on goal favoured Milton 47-19.

Now 19-2-1-1 and ranked fifth nationally for a second straight week, the IceHawks close out their best first half of the season in franchise history this weekend. Tonight they host the Royal Bank Cup host Streetsville Derbys and tomorrow they head to Georgetown to take on the Raiders.
