## Ice rink to be made at the old ballpark

Nassagaweya residents will have an ice rink again this winter but it will be at the old Campbellville ballpark off of Wheelihan Way.

Due to some issues last year, the Town of Milton chose to change locations, said Ward 3 Councillor Cindy Lunau.

"Last year, the ice rink was built on the new Campbellville ballpark behind the plaza, but we had issues with improper freezing due to the grass and there was a noticeable slope where the water would run off," said Ms Lunau.

"The ice rink was built at the old ball diamond with much success so we chose to move it back there. We needed a location with maximum availability for residents and potential success for the ice at a minimal cost."

Ms Lunau said the boards are already in place and flooding will begin as soon as the ground freezes thoroughly.

"The ice rink will be flooded by the firefighters at the number 2 station as soon as the ground freezes. The one thing we are working towards right now is installing some temporary lighting for night skating," she said.


Once the rink is up and running, the Town will maintain it by clearing the ice after any major snowfalls, said Ms Lunau.
