Police were unable to say what

school the youths in the initial incident attend, but did say the teens involved know each other.

Four youths — who can't be identified under the Youth Criminal Justice Act — are each facing a charge of aggravated assault, while three of them have also been charged with mischief under \$5,000 for damage to a house during the incident.

In addition, one of the teens has been charged with possession of a weapon dangerous to the public.
