Ms Hiscock was thrilled with the beautiful buttermilk buckskin (cham-


ois) colouring of Faux Finish's coat and has bred Puchi Trap, currently in foal, to Guaranteed Gold two more

She said she believes the unique colouring adds to Faux Finish's magnetism.


