Turning in a surprisingly stellar half-iron man debut recently at the Miami Man, the 34-year-old Milton native — who now lives in Tampa, Florida — tamed the grueling 1.2 mile swim, 56-mile bike and 13.1 mile run in just under five hours.

The 4.59:44 performance, amidst hot and windy conditions, placed her first among all female competitors and 29th overall.

"A lot of people were shocked with my finish, along with myself," said Good, who spent the first 28 years of her life in town and whose parents David and Krys still reside here. "I really didn't expect this. I'm still glowing."

Good had won a dozen straight sprint triathlons this year before tackling the halfiron, which she spent two solid months training for.

That preparation certainly paid off, as she grabbed a comfortable lead during the bike portion of the race and wound up finishing a convincing seven-and-a-half minutes ahead of her closest female opponent.

Admitted Good, "I had some intestinal issues from the four-mile mark on during the run, but basically I just gutted it out."

While she didn't get involved in triathlon competition until moving to Florida, Good said watching a women's only event in


