## Household products distributor now open

*Reckitt Benckiser sets up shop at Crossroads*

The Town of Milton is welcoming the first business to settle in the new Milton Crossings Business Park.

Reckitt Benckiser Canada Inc., a global manufacturer and distributor of household products, is now calling the 50-acre business park home.

"We are pleased to have Reckitt Benckiser as a member of our corporate community," said Mayor Gord Krantz.

"We work hard to attract companies like Reckitt Benckiser because they provide excellent employment opportunities and contribute to our industrial base."

The first phase of the Milton Crossroads Business Park, which fronts Hwy. 401 at

Steeles Avenue, was completed in the summer and is 352,000 square feet. The second phase is scheduled to be completed at the end of January.

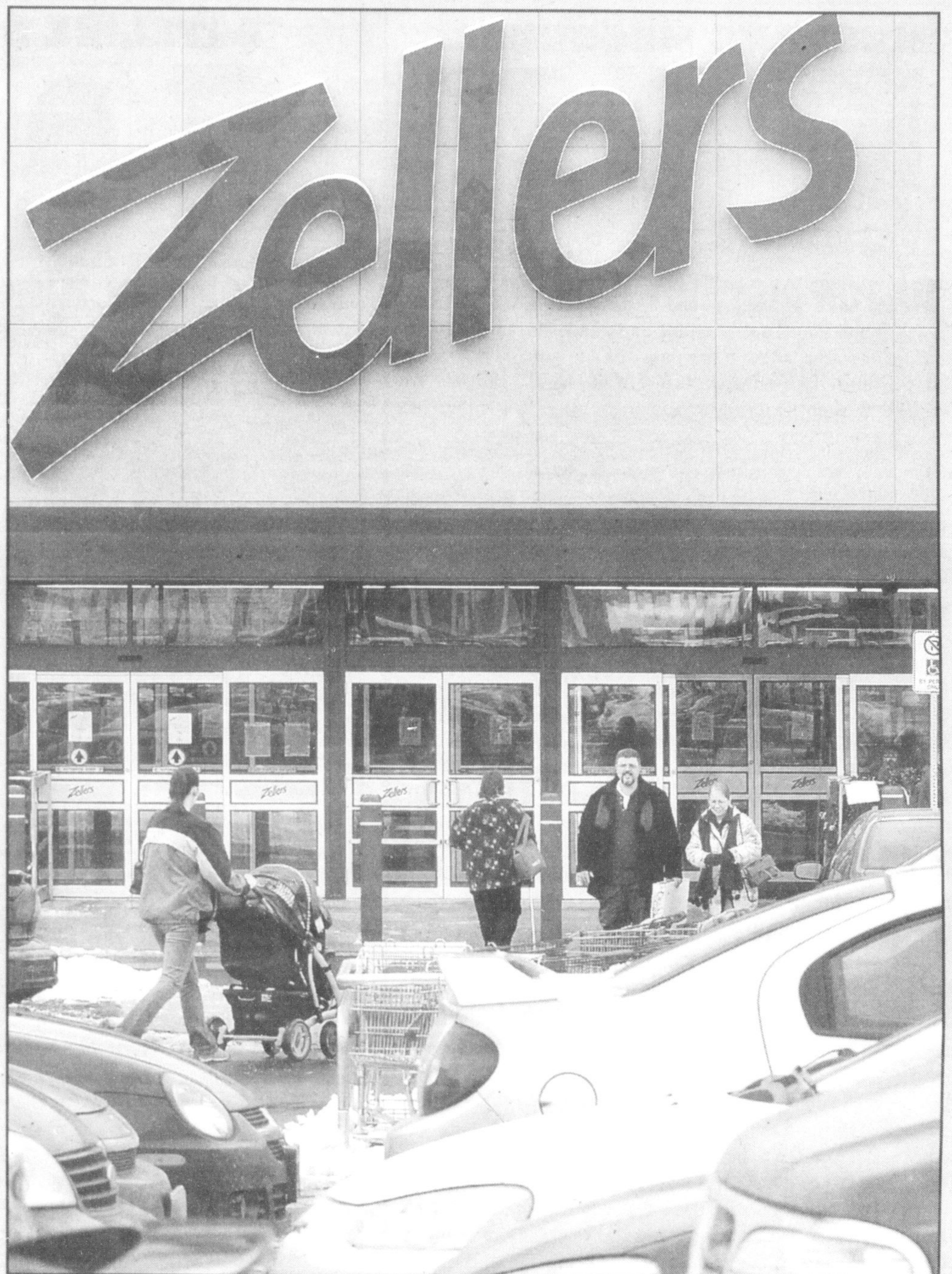
When it's finished, the business park will total more than 800,000 square feet of state-of-the-art bulk distribution and warehouse facilities.

Reckitt Benckiser is using 192,000 square feet for storage and distribution. The rest of the space is available for new companies moving to town.

Milton Crossings is a joint venture development of Verus Partners and Société immobilière Trans-Québec.

"Acquiring and developing sites in Milton is at the core of our strategy for the GTA region," said Rob Ramsay of Verus Partners.

"We look forward to an exciting and profitable future here."
