Senior Kindergarten 2006-2007:

Children must be 5 years old by December 31, 2006.

Note: If your child is currently attending one of our schools for Junior Kindergarten, you do not need to register for Senior Kindergarten.

To determine your designated home school, access our website www.hdsb.ca and review our on-line boundary maps or use "School Locator" (click on "School Information", then "Find a School"). Call your designated school to find out which dates have been established for Kindergarten registration.

Parents/guardians must be public school supporters.

Please bring the following **original** documents with you*:

Hawks beef up for playoffs

It's safe to say the IceHawks made the biggest acquisitions at the trade deadline — at least from a literal standpoint.

Already sporting a championship-calibre roster but somewhat lacking in physical presence, Milton beefed up considerably with the addition of 6'5", 220 lbs. defenceman Paul Dawson from the Oakville Blades and 6'3", 185 lbs. winger Alex Eaton of the OHL's Barrie Colts.

"We felt we needed to get a little bigger and tougher and we've addressed that," said interim head coach Joe Washkurak Tuesday evening, shortly before his nationally top ranked squad brushed aside the host Bramalea Blues 7-1 at Victoria Park Arena.

"We had to give up young Brandon DeFazio to get Dawson, which means giving up a bit of our future, but we're happy with the moves we've made."

Along with adding size and toughness to the blue-line, 20-year-old Dawson brings leadership and considerable playoff experience to the IceHawks — having been part of lengthy runs with Oakville the last two years, with a Western Conference championship captured in 2004. Said Washkurak, "Yeah that's a big plus for us, especially since there's only a few guys here from last season."

Dealt to Milton after the Colts reached their limit of over-agers with two recent pick-ups, 20-year-old Eaton spent nearly three seasons in the OHL — mostly with the Sudbury Wolves.

He's widely considered one of the tougher forwards that was available at this year's trade deadline and has the penalty minutes to back up that claim.

Neither newcomer was in the lineup in Bramalea

Tuesday night, when the IceHawks set a new franchise record for most games without a loss — surpassing the old mark of 17 set by the 2002/03 squad.

Fittingly enough, that season's head coach and general manager — Mario Cicchillo and Dave Brown, who are now with the Mississauga IceDogs — were in attendance for the record-breaking victory.

The duo still hold the benchmark for the longest winning streak, since their 17-game run featured all wins compared with 17 victories and a tie for the current contingent.

"Hey, it's the Ws that count," quipped Cicchillo.

Jason Bergeron led Milton's latest blowout with two goals and an assist. Contributing a goal and an assist each were Aaron Lewicki and Matt Read — who extended his scoring streak to six games

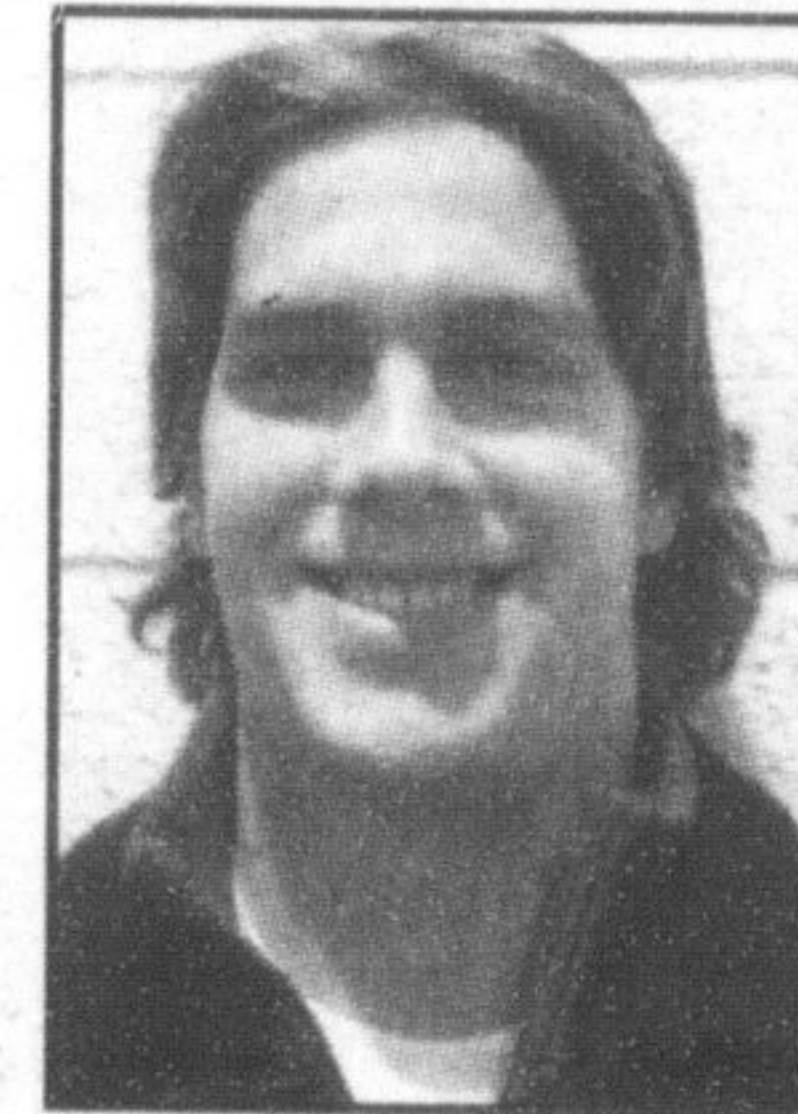
with a first-period rebound deposit and set up Lewicki in the second to hit the 50-point plateau.

Pulling within three points of that half-century mark with three helpers was Jeff Caister.

Bramalea spoiled back-up cager Andrew Loverock's shutout bid midway through the third.

Tuesday's win pushed Milton to 33-2-2-1.

IceHawk notes: Loverock and rookie defenceman Cody Goloubeff represented Milton at Wednesday's Prospects Game in Bramalea ... Out for the last two weeks with ligament damage to his pinky, blueliner Jason Fortino was expected back last night when the IceHawks played in Brampton. Tonight they head home to take on Georgetown and continue their quest for a perfect record at home. Sunday they host Bramalea and will admit any minor hockey players free who wear their team jerseys to the 3 p.m. game ... Dawson is currently nursing a minor knee injury and should make his Milton debut sometime next week.
