## All-candidates meeting gets heated

Liberal MP and Tory hopeful trade blows over variety of issues

Sparks flew between Liberal MP Gary Carr and Conservative candidate Garth Turner over everything from abortion to their respective party's campaign ads at an all candidates meeting at Bishop Reding Secondary School Thursday evening.

The session, hosted by the Milton Jaycees and

Chamber of Commerce, saw Mr. Carr, Mr. Turner, NDP candidate A n w a r

Green Party
flagbearer Dr. Kyle Grice square off on everything from affordable housing to transportation before a crowd of about 200 concerned Miltonians.

The heated exchanges between the Liberal and Conservative started when the notwithstanding clause was brought up, which has become a hot topic since Prime Minister Paul Martin said he'd do away with it in the Constitution if re-elected.

Mr. Carr said he's concerned if the

Conservatives have the notwithstanding clause, its party members will use it to push for private members' bills on things like abortion.

"We have no plans to revisit abortion," Mr.

Turner insisted, noting he "can't believe the Liberal member has brought up the abortion card." The pair sparred again when asked for their positions on running "negative" campaigns, referring

to the unfavourable ads that've been showing up in the media lately.

Mr. Carr said the ads are "disgraceful" and often

taken out of context. But, he said he also thinks any candidate's record should be put out for the public to see before they head to the ballot box.

"I'll put my record up against yours any day of the week," the MP told Mr. Turner.

"We're a little upset, aren't we?" Mr. Turner
